A. Philippians 2:14 - Don't Complain.

1 Corinthians 10:8-11

B. Philippians 2:15-16 - Live _____ as God's Children.

Testament imagery of **living a life of righteous character**, seeking the Lord. *Innocent* is related to this. The *Exegetical Guide to the Greek New Testament - Philippians* says this word, "was used in Paul's day to describe undiluted wine or unalloyed metal. Applied to people, it conveyed the idea of simplicity of character, purity, guiltlessness, or innocence (H-M144; "innocent" [NRSV, ESV]; "pure" [NIV, NJB, HCSB]; "pure, innocent" [BDAG35d]; "that which is still in its original state of intactness, totality or moral innocence" [G. Kittel, *TDNT*1.209]). The noun appears only twice elsewhere in NT ("innocent as doves" [[Matt 10:16](#)]; "guileless, unsophisticated" with respect to evil [[Rom 16:19](#)])."

New American Commentary: "Paul ended this section with a personal appeal. His converts were his life. Equally, his life was Christ. Like other seeming paradoxes, this one blended perfectly in Paul's mind. He urged them to progress in their lives so that his efforts would be profitable. Looking to the day of Christ, the day of judgment, he wanted to have fruit from his labor. Using athletic imagery, he stated he wanted not "to have run ... for nothing." At other places, he expressed that desire in terms of his personal understanding of Christ ([3:12-14](#))."

C. Philippians 2:17-18 - Rejoicing in _____ .

The *EGGNT*: "It is not the absence of suffering that generates joy in Paul but, rather, the presence of sacrifice, inspired by faith in Christ, whether his own or that of others ([Hansen190](#))."
