While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling apparel. And as they were frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead?"

He is not here, but has risen. Now it was Mary Magdalene and Joanna and Mary the mother of James and the other women with them who told these things to the apostles,

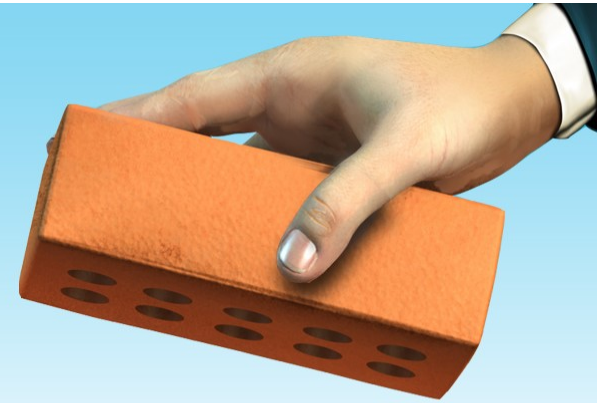
A. The Empty Tomb

Women could not testify in court.

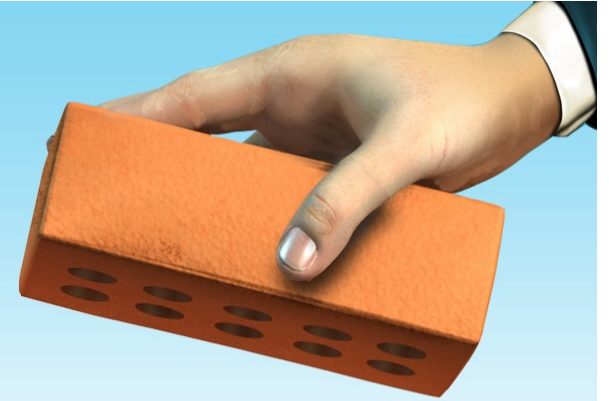


The Garden Tomb

place.

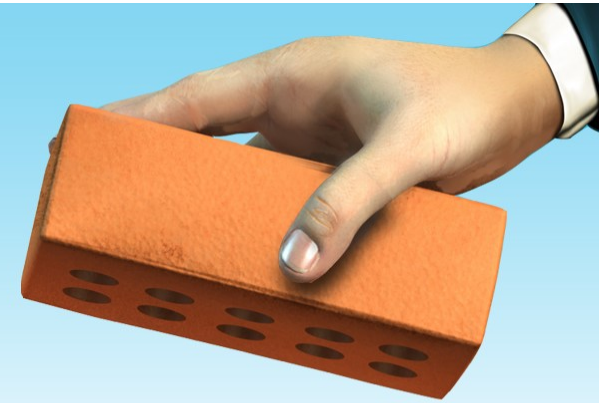

Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into His glory?” And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, He interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself.

B. The Road to Emmaus

Luke 24:13-35

Jesus had a physical, yet glorified body.

What was His body like?

The resurrection is a very serious truth!

It is *historical fact*. It is *theological truth*.

1 Corinthians 15:42-49 (ESV)

So is it with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable; what is raised is **imperishable**. It is sown in dishonor; it is raised in **glory**. It is sown in weakness; it is raised in **power**. It is sown a natural body; it is raised a **spiritual body**. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body. Thus it is written, “The first man Adam became a living being”; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit.

But it is not the spiritual that is first but the natural, and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second Man is from heaven. As was the man of dust, so also are those who are of the dust, and as is the Man of heaven, so also are those who are of heaven. Just as we have borne the image of the man of dust, we shall also bear the image of the Man of heaven.

Don't tell someone, "Just believe." if they are truly struggling.

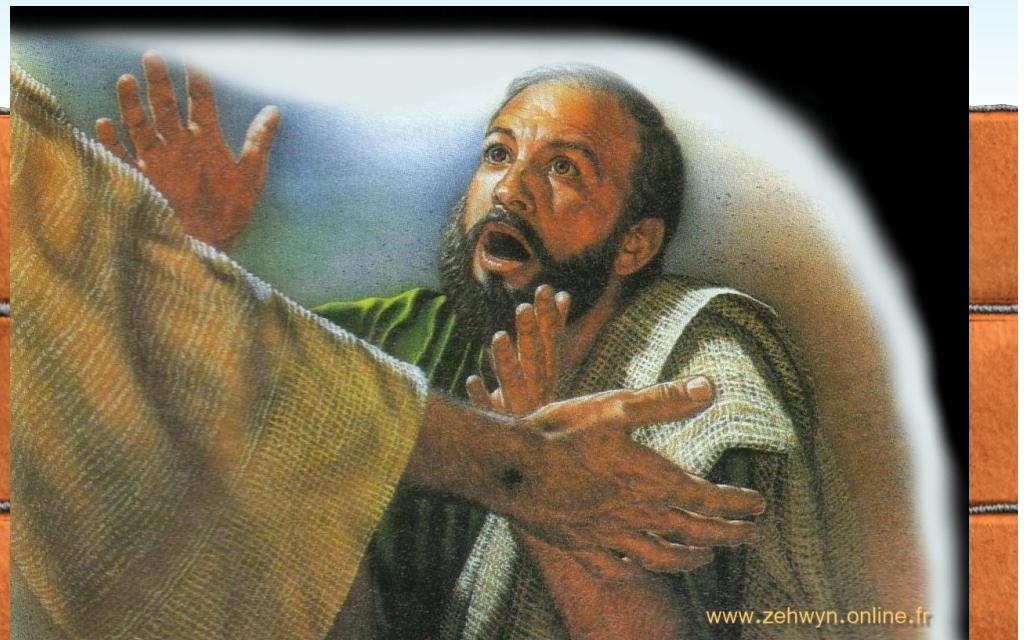
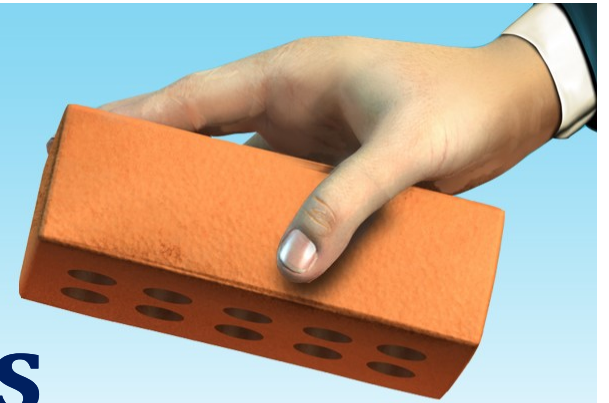
