


Gender, Sexuality, and the Image of God



Evangelical Lutheran Church in America Distributes Handbook on Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity - June 29, 2020

"The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America has distributed a handbook on sexual orientation, gender identity and gender expression.

According to the <u>Christian Post</u>, the handbook, "Lutheran Introduction to Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity, and Gender

Expression," ... helps "all sexual orientations and gender identities."

... The handbook also defines gender identity as "a person's innate, deeply felt psychological identification as a man, woman or another gender, which may or may not correspond to the sex assigned to them at birth. Gender identity is different from the term 'gender', which is typically used with

reference to social and cultural differences rather than biological ones."

Gender expression is defined as "the external characteristics and behaviors that are socially defined as either masculine or feminine, such as dress, grooming, mannerisms, speech patterns and social interactions. These norms vary culturally."

Finally, the handbook defines sexual orientation as "the term used to describe what gender(s) someone is physically and/or emotionally attracted to. Lesbian, gay, bisexual, pansexual, queer, and straight are all examples of sexual orientations. A person's sexual orientation is distinct from a person's gender identity and expression." Some religious leaders have criticized the

ELCA for being "radical" in its policies. In April, the ELCA faced criticism after posting a prayer on social media addressing God as "Mother."

"Mother God, you have fed us with the nourishment of your spiritual food. Raise us up into salvation and rid us of our bitterness, so that we may share the sweetness of your holy word with all the world," the <u>ELCA</u>

1. Man

Paul uses the creation model in 1 Timothy 2:8-15 as the foundation for stating men are to lead the church. While men and women have their natural talents and spiritual gifts, God has given the primary leadership role to men.

3. Roles of Men and Womenb. In Society

...Men and women can share most job positions... While there is freedom in society for different roles, we have seen a large shift away from male leadership to female leadership. This has caused a lot of problems.

"People tend to use the terms "sex" and "gender" interchangeably. But, while connected, the two terms are not equivalent. Generally, we assign a newborn's sex as either male or female (some US states and other countries offer a third option) based on the baby's genitals. Once a sex is assigned, we presume the child's gender. For some

people, this is cause for little, if any, concern or further thought because their gender aligns with gender-related ideas and assumptions associated with their sex. Nevertheless, while gender may begin with the assignment of our sex, it doesn't end there. A person's gender is the complex interrelationship between three dimensions:

body, identity, and social gender.

Body: our body, our experience of our own body, how society genders bodies, and how others interact with us based on our body.

Identity: the name we use to convey our gender based on our deeply held, internal sense of self. Identities typically fall into

binary (e.g. man, woman) nonbinary (e.g., genderqueer, genderfluid, etc) or ungendered (e.g., agender, genderless) categories. The meaning associated with a particular identity can vary among individuals using the same term. A person's gender identity can correspond to or differ from the sex they were assigned at birth.

Social gender: how we present our gender in the world and how individuals, society, culture, and community perceive, interact with, and try to shape our gender. Social gender includes gender roles and expectations and how society uses those to try to enforce conformity to current gender norms.

Each of these dimensions can vary greatly across a range of possibilities and is distinct from, but interrelated with, the others. A person's comfort in their gender is related to the degree to which these three dimensions feel in harmony..."
