Memory Verse

Romans 8:30

Moreover who He predestined, these He also called; whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified.





The Gospel is 5 things:

- 1. Christ died for our sins
- 2. He was buried
- 3. He *physically arose* again on the *third* day
 - 4. Was seen by many
 - 5. According to the Scriptures

- 1. I have been saved from the penalty of sin: Justification.
- 2. I am being saved from the power of sin: Sanctification: 2 "tenses:"
 - a. Positional Sanctification.
 - b. Progressive Sanctification.
- 3. I will be saved from the presence of sin: Glorification.

A. The Truth of our Glorification

Glorification is when we get our new bodies at the return of Jesus.

We are going to go through it systematically. We will look at what the whole of Scripture says about this.


A. The Truth of our Glorification Job 19:25-27 - For I know my Redeemer lives and He shall stand at last on the earth; and after my skin is destroyed (struck off), this I know, that in my flesh I shall see God, whom I shall see for myself, and my eyes shall behold, and not another. My heart yearns within me!

A. The Truth of our Glorification

Psalm 17:15 — As for me (David), I will see

Your (God's) face in righteousness; I shall be satisfied when I awake in Your likeness.

This Psalm is a prayer to God for deliverance from his enemies and confidence God will rescue him.



A. The Truth of our Glorification

The New Linguistic and Exegetical Key to the Greek New Testament, p. 332 says about this word in the aorist tense,


"Aor. speaks of God who sees the end from the beginning and in whose decree and purpose all fut. (future) events are comprehended and fixed (Hodge)."

B. The Timing of our Glorification

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 - But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers, about those who are asleep, that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. 14For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep. 15For this we declare to you by a word from the Lord, that

B. The Timing of our Glorification

we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will not precede those who have fallen asleep. 16For the Lord himself will descend from heaven with a cry of command, with the voice of an archangel, and with the sound of the trumpet of God. And the dead in Christ will rise first. 17Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught



B. The Timing of our Glorification These verses come right before Paul's discussion on the Day of the Lord. This is God's judgment of the world, purging of Israel and protection of Israel, beginning after the midpoint of Daniel's 70th Week or

the 7-year period...

B. The Timing of our Glorification 1 Corinthians 15:50-57 - I tell you this, brothers: flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable. 51Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, 52in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be

B. The Timing of our Glorification raised imperishable, and we shall be changed. 53For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality. 54When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory." 55"O death, where



is your victory? O death, where is your sting?" <u>56</u>The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. <u>57</u>But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

B. The Timing of our Glorification ... We must be glorified to live in glory!

He mentions a ...mystery – this term is used other places: Romans 11:25, Ephesians 3:3 and more. It means something not reveled in the Old Testament, but revealed in the New, but was always part of God's plan...

B. The Timing of our Glorification Every Christian, dead or alive, will be changed, transformed, resurrected, or glorified at the return of Christ at the last trump, a reference to the fifth Feast of Israel, the Feast of Trumpets, where God calls His own to His presence and goes to war with the world in the Day of the Lord.

C. The Transformation at our Glorification Philippians 3:20-21 - For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body that it may be conformed to His glorious body, according to the working by which He is able even to subdue all things to Himself...


C. The Transformation at our Glorification

1 John 3:2 – Beloved, now we are children of God; and it has not yet been revealed what we shall be, but we know that when He is revealed, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is.

C. The Transformation at our Glorification 1 Corinthians 15:35-41 - in verses 35-41 Paul talks about a question that would arise from the previous verses. He says that seeds die and produce grain and speaks about the bodies or forms: humans, animals, fish, birds, the sun, moon and stars. God gives specific forms or bodies to each of these and that includes our bodies now and in the future.

C. The Transformation at our Glorification 1 Corinthians 15:42-49 - So is it with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable; what is raised is imperishable. 43It is sown in dishonor; it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness; it is raised in power. 44It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body. 45Thus it is

written, "The first man Adam became a living being:" the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. 46But it is not the spiritual that is first but the natural, and then the spiritual. 47The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven. 48As was the man of dust, so also are those who are of the dust, and as is the man of heaven, so also



C. The Transformation at our Glorification Our bodies are sown or planted: corruptible, in dishonor, weakness, natural, but will be raised: incorruptible, in glory, power and spiritual. The negatives are due to sin, Adam's and ours. We are dying, weak, diseased, sensual or sinful... The positives are due to Christ: unending, honor and dignity, strength and supernatural...

The Gospels speak about His glorified body:

He appeared: Matthew 28, Mark 16,

Luke 24, John 20-21, Acts 1

He had physicality: Luke 24:39

He spoke: Matthew 28:9-10

He ate: Luke 24:41-43

He was different but recognizable: Luke

24:16, 31, John 20:14-16

He cooked: John 21:9-10,

He appeared and disappeared at will:

Luke 24:30-32

He prophesied: John 21:18-19

He has all authority: Matthew 28:18

He ascended: Acts 1:9

He is alive forever: Revelation 1:18

This gives us insight to the body we will have. The physical body we have in life will be transformed at our resurrection or glorification. We will be ourselves, only better! We will have the perfect body we have always wanted! We will be able to eat, speak and appear and disappear at will and live forever. While Jesus' body is unique, because He is God, ours will resemble His.
