

In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit"







We defined the Gospel, studied the 3
"phases" of salvation, looked at Redemption,
Peace and Hope, and last time studied
Adoption within the context of Roman
culture and the New Testament:

1. Losing all rights to the old family and gaining all rights of the new family as a fully legitimate son.

- 2. An heir to the father's estate.
- 3. The old life is completely wiped out.
- 4. Becoming literally and absolutely the son of the new father.
- 5. Because we are in a new family, we are to love one another.



A. Ephesians 1:5-6 - Election in Christ Ephesians 1:3-6 - Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, 4even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love 5he predestined us for adoption to himself as sons through Jesus



A. Ephesians 1:5-6 – Election in Christ Paul is talking to the Jews, because of the pronouns "us" and "we." Though his emphasis is the Jews, he records that Gentiles have been brought into the spiritual blessings in Christ. Next, Paul says this about the Jews...

A. *Ephesians* 1:5-6 – Election in Christ 1. *Chosen* 1:4, 2:1, 5


Verses 3-14 are a doxology or praise, and it is the longest sentence in Greek in the Bible. The Jews were a chosen people, which Paul reiterates in 1:4, 2:1, 5. In the Old Testament, God chose Israel! Election has to do with purpose...

A. Ephesians 1:5-6 - Election in Christ

2. Predestined 1:5, 11

In love, He predestined them: 1:5, 11, or marked out beforehand or predetermine. This refers to the Jews predestined to be adopted by His will. If they were chosen in Christ, predestined to adoption by God's decision, how can they lose that...

B. Ephesians 1:7-10 - Redemption in Christ Ephesians 1:7-10 - In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, 8which he lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight 9making known to us the mystery of his will, according to his purpose, which he set forth in Christ 10as a plan for the fullness of time,

C. 1:11-14, 18 - Inheritance in Christ Ephesians 1:11-14, 18 - In him we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will, 12so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of his glory. 13In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation,

C. 1:11-14, 18 - Inheritance in Christ and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, 14who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of his glory... 18having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints.

C. 1:11-14, 18 - Inheritance in Christ

1. Inheritance - 11-12, 14

Paul talks to the Jews about their inheritance, which was everything. It included land, finances, and a spiritual blessing. If these were lost, it would have been a catastrophe. In verse 13, Paul changes pronouns to "you" and "your," referring to the Gentiles...

C. 1:11-14, 18 – Inheritance in Christ 2. Sealed - 13-14, 2 Cor. 1:21-22

...Sealing meant ownership, protection and security. There is more, but these 3 will suffice. The one who sealed something owned it, protected it and promised security for it. Salvation is of the Lord, and He seals us, owns us and protects us...

C. 1:11-14, 18 - Inheritance in Christ

2. Sealed - 13-14, 2 Cor. 1:21-22

The Holy Spirit. He indwells believers at the moment of salvation. Galatians 3:14b says we receive ...the promise of the Spirit through faith. Because He indwells us we have confidence we can't lose our salvation. The Holy Spirit is God's gift.

C. 1:11-14, 18 - Inheritance in Christ

3. Adopted - 1:5, Rom. 8:14-15, Gal. 4:4-5

...He owns us! He bought us from slavery and bondage to become His and we are His slave. Yet, we are also *His children*. As His child, He promises to protect and provide for us. Remember, in ancient Rome, *once you were adopted*, you could not be un-adopted...

1. The Nature of Mankind – 2:1-3, 5

Ephesians 2:1-3, 5 - And you were dead in the trespasses and sins 2in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience - 3among whom we all once

lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind... <u>5</u>even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ - by grace you have been saved...

2. The Love of God – 2:4, 6-10

Ephesians 2:4, 6-10 - But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us... 6and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, 7so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his

grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. <u>8</u>For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, <u>9</u>not a result of works, so that no one may boast. <u>10</u>For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.

2. The Love of God – 2:4, 6-10

He saved them and us because of His love and grace. We are secure in Christ because salvation is not by works, but by His work and grace. We are saved to do good works, not saved or kept by doing good works. If we are not secure in His love, then we are in big trouble...

- 1. Revelation 3:5 He who overcomes shall be clothed in white garments, and I will not blot out his name from the Book of Life.
- 2. Judas never truly believed.
- 3. 1 John 3:4-6 vs. 6 whoever abides in Him, does not sin. Whoever sins has neither seen Him nor known Him.

- 4. Philippians 2:12 Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling.
- 5. Galatians 5:4 You have become estranged (separated) from Christ, you who attempt to be justified by law, you have fallen (lose one's grasp) from grace.

- 6. James 2:17, 20, 26 Faith without works is dead.
- 7. Hebrews 6:4-6 and 10:26-31.
- 8. Is it arrogant to say "I have eternal life and am secure?"
- 9. I don't feel saved.

10. If I am secure, I can continue to live in sin.

A billion times NO! Anyone who understands the grace of God WILL NOT want to continue in a life of sin. Those who think God's grace is license to sin do not know God's grace!

Other phrases describe our security: **Eternal life:** Matthew 25:46, John 3:14-16 (2) times), John 10:27-29, Acts 13:48, Romans 5:21, Titus 3:7, and 1 John: 2:25, 5:11-13. -Eternal life is connected to the Person of **Christ!** We are in Him and He is in us, forever. In Hebrews 13:5 God said will never leave you or forsake you...

In Romans 8:28-39, we find that believers are ...more than conquerors — or a "super" or "over-conqueror," referring to the certainty of victory. Nothing can separate us from God's love in/through Christ Jesus our Lord. The word "separate" in verses 35 and 39 mean, "to put apart, separate, sever..."
