I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.



Be Transformed, Not Conformed Romans 12:1-2

Context

Paul wrote Romans in the mid 50's. The theme is God's righteousness... He speaks of humanities condemnation in Romans 1-3:20... justification in 3:21-5:21... in chapters 6-8, sanctification is discussed. Chapter 8 ends with his discussion on glorification... Chapters 9-11 deal with Israel: past - 9, present - 10 and future - 11...

Romans 12:1-2

I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.

A. 12:1 - A Living Sacrifice

Paul has a passionate plea. ... I appeal to you. Other translations say - plead, beseech, urge, exhort, and some translations have the "Therefore" first. But the word for appeal carries with it the idea of being up close and personal as a continuous request. It is almost as if Paul was there personally, making this request to them.

A. 12:1 - A Living Sacrifice

...therefore – when we see this word or one related to it, we need to ask - What is this there for? He says... by the mercies of God – not "mercy" but "mercies."

What is mercy?

Grace is being given something good you don't deserve. Mercy is not getting what you deserve!

A. 12:1 - A Living Sacrifice Paul is speaking of everything he's written about thus far in chapters 1-11: depravity, condemnation, grace, salvation by faith alone and more. Remember, there were no chapter breaks or verses in the original manuscript. Paul speaks of how God gives victory in Jesus and makes us a co-heir with Him and the resurrection of our bodies...

A. 12:1 - A Living Sacrifice We must learn truth first! We cannot apply God's truth if we do not know God's truth! A proper understanding of Biblical doctrine must come before application. Yes, we can learn a lot and not apply it. That is another problem. But a problem in the church today worldwide, is skipping interpretation and going directly to application.


A. 12:1 - A Living Sacrifice We obey Him, because of His love for us, and we understand His love for us, when we understand His mercies. We understand His mercies because we don't just know the truth, but act on that truth, because we have a right relationship with the God of the universe, only because of His grace and mercy!

A. 12:1 – A Living Sacrifice
The Jews in the Roman assembly fully
understood what Paul meant. They knew all
about the sacrificial system God gave in the
Mosaic Law...

The gentiles also understood about sacrifices. Sacrifices were offered to the pagan gods of Rome, so this was a familiar concept to his audience.

A. 12:1 - A Living Sacrifice You can only offer it once. Paul, a Jew, tells believers to offer their bodies as a living sacrifice. This is something they would do daily, and all of the time, not just once... This is... your reasonable or rational service or worship. Paul is using the imagery of the priests in the Temple, serving God by fulfilling their responsibilities in religious service.

B. 12:2 - A Transformed Life Do not be conformed to this world or age. He issues a warning, or something NOT to do. Don't do something that doesn't reflect who we truly are in Christ! The form of the words indicates they were doing things they should not have been doing... already conformed to the world. The word for "conformed" can also be translated "molded."



B. 12:2 - A Transformed Life We are not to be "molded" by the world but molded by the Word! Every Christian will be molded by one or the other. Yes, we struggle in life, have our personal battles, the onslaught of the lies of satan in the world and more. This world or better translated, "age" is specific in the Jewish mind.

B. 12:2 - A Transformed Life Don't live the way the world lives. Don't curse. Don't be greedy. Don't seek vengeance. Don't be unforgiving. Don't reflect their ungodly values. Don't lie, cheat, steal, manipulate, control, or be controlled by others. Don't look at life, people and circumstances the way the unsaved do! Don't have the same worldview the world does...

B. 12:2 - A Transformed Life Satan rules the hearts of unsaved mankind! God is in control, but the enemy has authority over those outside of Christ! This is the spiritual warfare we are in and it is REAL. Don't take things so personally when your mocked, made fun of or attacked. If you are a Christian, living a godly life, there will be people who won't like you...

Do I believe God is the Creator, or do I believe in evolution?

Do I believe that *life begins at conception*, based on what the *Bible* and *science* say, or do I believe *abortion is ok*?

Do I believe that homosexuality is ok with God, or do I believe it is a sin that can be forgiven?

Do I believe pornography is ok, or do I believe it is a sin that demeans those in the picture and those who look at it?


Do I truly believe Jesus is the only way of salvation, or do I believe there are many ways to God?


Do I believe you need works to be saved or stay saved?



B. 12:2 – A Transformed Life

By being... transformed by the renewing of our mind - The battle begins in our mind, what and how we think and the perspective through which we look at life. Our actions, words, attitude, feelings and desires begin in our mind! The Greek word for "transformed" is "metamorphoo," where we get "metamorphosis" from and it means "to change."





B. 12:2 – A Transformed Life Change your thinking and look at life through the lenses of the Bible. This is how to have a Biblical worldview. As we change our thinking based on God's truth, we are transformed and ...prove - test, examine or discern what God's will is. We will be able to know what God wants us to do...

B. 12:2 – A Transformed Life By this we find what is... good, acceptable, mature or perfect – in God's sight in EVERY situation. The Old Testament writers used these words to describe sacrificial animals without defect. God's purpose, His will and His way are His best for us.
